Purpose of Report

1. To inform Elected Members of the current arrangements in relation to check off facilities, and propose agreement that the Authority reinstate check off facilities for the Fire Brigades Union.

Recommendation

2. That members agree to the reinstatement of check off facilities for the Fire Brigades Union.

Background

- 3. The Fire Authority took the decision to remove check off facilities granted to the Fire Brigades Union in October 2009.
- 4. Check off arrangements allow the relevant Trade Union to collect its membership subscriptions directly at source from its member's salary each pay period. This represents a cost efficient collection method, and removes the needs for alternative collection methods such as Direct Debit. The facility has remained in place for all other Trade Unions during this intervening period.

Reinstatement

- 5. The Authority took the decision to remove this facility at a time of industrial unrest, but it is now felt that a revised spirit and intent demonstrated by the Fire Brigades Union of meeting the challenges faced by the Fire Authority particularly in relation to the Comprehensive Spending Review and budget reductions in a constructive manor warrants a revision of this decision.
- 6. It is believed that the ongoing positive work detailed within the progress report included on this agenda supports the proposal.
