Purpose of Report

1. To present the Annual Environmental Report for 2010/11

Introduction & Background

- 3. MFRS was one of the first Fire Services to implement an Environmental Management System, adopt a Local Authority Carbon Management Plan and sign up to both 30% Carbon Reduction Target and the 'Nottingham Declaration' to address Climate Change impacts.
- 4. Now the Environmental Management System is reaching maturity, the energy, water and waste trends can clearly be seen and the linkage to Carbon Emissions is quantified.
- 5. The next two years work in implementing carbon reduction projects is crucial, if we are to meet our targets. In particular the significant investment in new and greener buildings.
- 6. Work is also underway to educate and address staff behaviours and thought processes through a network of Management and Environmental Champions in place at Stations and support sites.
