Bonfires & Fireworks



REMEMBER: If a fire engine is called out to deliberate bonfires, wheelie bin fires and rubbish fires, this may delay the response to other emergencies.

5 bonfire

related incidents last bonfire period.



DO NOT

give anyone combustible materials for use on bonfires.

REMEMBER: Only buy fireworks from retailers registered with MFRS.

BONFIRES

are only allowed on private land with the owner's permission and must be supervised by an adult at all times.



REMEMBER: Keep water handy and ensure the fire is completely out before leaving.

GET ORGANISED

Check your local authority's website for details of organised displays in your area.



PETS

can be frightened by fireworks and should be kept indoors if possible to avoid unnecessary distress.







Follow the **Firework Code**





- Keep fireworks in a closed box
- Follow the instructions on each firework
- Light them at arm's length, using a taper
- Stand well back
- Always supervise children around fireworks
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves
- Keep pets indoors

DON'TS X



- Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode
- Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw
- Never give sparklers to a child under five
- Don't let off fireworks after 11pm

COSTUMES

can easily catch fire from naked flames such as candles, fires, lighters and matches.

REMEMBER: Keep children wearing costumes well away from naked flames and other heat sources at all times.

PUMPKINS

are great fun to carve but take extra care when lighting them. Make sure no loose clothing is near them at any time.



TOP TIP: Use LED battery operated tea lights instead of normal candles.
