- 7. At the Annual General Meeting on the 9th June 2022, it was agreed that the PCC for Merseyside be appointed to the Committee with full voting rights. It is recommended that this appointment continues.
- 8. The Authority also has a Co-opted Member, Mr Anthony Boyle who is appointed to the Scrutiny and Audit Committee to provide additional independent scrutiny.
