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		The National Fire Chiefs Council (NFCC) United Kingdom Fire Cadets (UKFC) have developed a national cadet voice forum to discuss how their voices and opinions can influence and contribute to future delivery. Liverpool City Council is also leading on becoming a 'Child Friendly City' and MFRS will utilise their principles to assist in shaping our youth policies and procedures.

The Office for the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) released statistics in July 2024 that show an 8% decrease in serious violence, and an 18.6% decrease in knife crime in Merseyside. Gun crime is also at its lowest level since records began 22 years ago.
